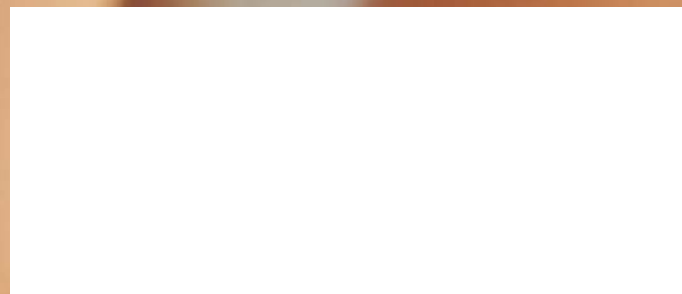

TOMORROW IS NOW AT THE DAVIS CAMPUS

This fall has been one of intense activity at Sheridan, much of it focused at our Davis Campus. October saw the grand openings of the Centre for Advanced Manufacturing and Design Technologies (CAMDT), the Sheridan High/Scope Teacher Education Centre, and a brand new Gymnasium.

The new gym was made possible through the support of our students and the Student Union, and is a wonderful addition to the Davis Campus. I invite all basketball fans to take in one of our men or women's varsity games and check out this great new facility. It will also be the site for the national college basketball championships in March.

The Sheridan High/Scope Teacher Education Centre is the first training facility of its kind in Canada, and results from our exclusive partnership with the High/Scope Foundation (based in Michigan), to provide accredited training in Canada. The Centre is co-located with the Region of Peel Collegeside Child Care Centre in a new building funded by the Region of Peel.

Our Centre for Advanced Manufacturing and Design Technologies not only offers a range of programs for students looking to enter the dynamic and expanding field of advanced manufacturing, but will also be a catalyst for

the sustained growth of this sector in Brampton and the surrounding region. This broader purpose is reflected in the support received from the City of Brampton and Ministry of Economic Development & Trade who provided the base funding for this project, contributing \$2.5 and \$2.9 million, respectively. A further 25 corporate partners collectively donated in excess of \$1,000,000 to support the Centre.

Thanks to the support of our public and private sector partners, as well as our students and alumni, we have made great strides towards fulfilling our vision for a transformed campus in Brampton – one that is attuned to the needs of this growing, diverse community. With the opening of these new facilities, Phase I of our Davis Campus plan is complete. Phase II will get underway in the near future, as we break ground on a \$20 million-plus new facility that will house our new Centre for Healthy Communities.

TWO INNOVATIVE TRAINING FACILITIES OPEN AT DAVIS CAMPUS >>

Manufacturing Centre Begins Training Students for Careers of the Future

Sheridan's Centre for Advanced Manufacturing and Design Technologies (CAMDT) is now open. Senior representatives from the Province of Ontario, the City of Brampton and Sheridan officially opened the door of the \$7 million training facility on October 14 at the Davis Campus.

The 18,000 square foot facility is designed to meet the needs of regional manufacturers by training future generations in the latest design and manufacturing technologies, to help address the shortage of skilled labour in Ontario. The Centre houses classrooms, advanced technology labs, and state-of-the-art equipment, including robotic systems, and 3D design and modeling capabilities.

"One out of every six jobs in Ontario is related to manufacturing, and in Brampton, that number rises to almost one out of every three,"

said Brampton Mayor, Susan Fennell. "This new facility will play an important role in keeping GTA manufacturers competitive by ensuring they have access to an ongoing supply of highly skilled workers." "The Centre represents an innovative solution to a growing problem, and is a testament to the shared goals and cooperation between Sheridan, two levels of government and local industry.

Although the Centre's goal is to address current and projected skills shortages in the GTA, the facility will also provide customized, in-house training to companies looking to train existing workers. COMBINED TEACHER EDUCATION/CHILD CARE CENTRE PROVIDES LEADING EDGE TRAINING

The new Sheridan High/Scope Teacher Education Centre and Region of Peel Collegieside Child Care Centre officially opened on October 26 in a new building at the Davis Campus. The facility is the first training centre to be officially endorsed by the High/Scope Educational Research Foundation.

The Education Centre provides training in the High/Scope approach to Sheridan's Early Childhood Education students (ECE), as well as practicing early childhood educators. Faculty members at the training centre also consult to many organizations specializing in early education, including TVO.

The Centre features leading edge technology that allows video streaming from the child care playrooms into the training facility, giving students the opportunity to observe children actively involved in the High/Scope curriculum.

The Region of Peel's Collegieside Child Care Centre opened last March, and is licensed for 63 children. The High/Scope educational approach, known throughout the world, was introduced in Peel's child care centers after staff received training through Sheridan and the High/Scope Foundation. The early childhood education centers operated by Sheridan were the first in Ontario to be accredited by the High/Scope Foundation

"We are the only training centre of this type, and we have an exclusive partnership with High/Scope to deliver their training in Canada, from the Quebec border to the B.C. border," says Moya Fewson Senior High/Scope Trainer. "This site is truly state-of-the-art. It is a beautiful, comfortable place for training and is well used. The partnership between Peel and the Sheridan High/Scope Teacher Education Centre is an excellent one."

ALUMNI RETURN HOME TO CELEBRATE

Sheridan President, Robert Turner, opened his Homecoming remarks with a saying: If you can remember the '70s you weren't really there. The Business, Nursing and hockey team graduates of 30 years ago proved otherwise as they renewed old friendships and recalled past glories at Homecoming 2005 on October 15.

Alumni from as far back as Sheridan's first graduating class in 1969 were on hand to celebrate the Class of '80; and take part in reunion activities for the Business Administration Classes of '70, '75 and '80, the Office Administration Class of '80, Retail Management Class of '80 and the Nursing Class of '75.

A welcoming reception honouring alumni from 1970, 1975 and 1980 was hosted by Robert Turner, who also presented commemorative pins at the Homecoming lunch to 65 alumni who graduated in or before 1980. The reception was held in a special memorabilia room filled with vintage photos, yearbooks and scrapbooks, sparking much reminiscing and laughter amongst alumni.

Before the reception and lunch festivities began, Arch Wilcox, Vice-President, Sales for Honda's Auto Division (Business Administration – Marketing 1975); Frank Falcone (Classical

Animation '91) Owner and Creative Director, GURU Animation; Moya Fewson, Sheridan Professor and Senior High/Scope Early Learning Educator; and John Hardisty, Sheridan Professor and Program Coordinator, enlightened both alumni and students with their insights into their respective areas of expertise.

Alumni at the lunch were the first to hear about an exciting email contest, The Best Times of Our Lives, that features a visit to the set of the television show CSI Las Vegas, as the grand prize. More details about this new campaign can be found on the back page of this magazine.

Later in the afternoon, members of the 1973-74 Bruins hockey team were inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame, cheered on by family, former classmates and faculty. The team has the distinction of being Sheridan's first-ever provincial champions, in tandem with the '73 football team.

Chris Tiernay, a key member of the men's volleyball team from 1981 to 1984, was also honoured during the induction ceremony. Over his three-year period with the team, the Bruins won two gold medals and one silver at the provincial championships. Tiernay, a member of the OCAA Hall of Fame, was named Sheridan Athlete of the Year twice, OCAA League All-Star two years running, and Canadian College National All-Canadian.

As well, another outstanding representative of Sheridan's athletic community, Dick Ruschiensky, former Athletic Director, Basketball and Golf Coach,

was inducted into the Hall of Fame in recognition of his outstanding commitment to Sheridan from 1971 until his retirement in 2000. During his tenure, the Bruins dominated the Canadian intercollegiate basketball and volleyball world, winning two national championships in each sport.

Ruschiensky recalled that period as one of "unbelievable excitement, joy and pleasure." He told the enthusiastic group at the induction ceremony, "It's great to know that somewhere other than on a tombstone, you will be remembered fondly."

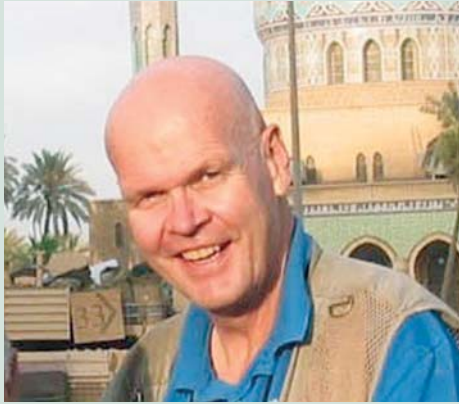

Jim Farrell – Have Pin, Will Travel JOURNALISM '88



When I came into my newsroom this past August, there was a small package on my desk. When I opened it, I almost wept. Inside was a Sheridan alumni pin, an alumni pen and a hand-written note from Faeye Johnston, Manager, Alumni Relations: “We’ve had trouble locating you as your address is inactive on the data-base. Hope this finds you.”

I wanted a new alumni pin, and now one had seemingly dropped out of the sky. About eight months ago, I lost the pin I received upon graduation. That pin had traveled with me throughout the world, attached to the photographer’s vests I wore on foreign assignments. Last year, back home in Edmonton, it fell off my vest and disappeared.

The arrival of a new pin couldn’t have been timelier. My employer, The Edmonton Journal, sent me back to Afghanistan on August 23 to cover our Canadian troops and the Fall national election in Kandahar.

When last in Afghanistan about a year ago, I’d felt naked without my good luck pin. The pin also permitted me to educate more than a few journalists from all over the world about our nation and my alma mater.

My assignments since joining The Journal in 1989 took me to the world’s pleasure spots: Bosnia, Kosovo, the northern tip of Ellesmere Island, the jungles of Ecuador, Baghdad in April 2003, New York for 9/11, the cockpit of a fighter jet, a squalid South American brothel and a soiree at Rideau Hall.

Because Sheridan’s program was multi-disciplinary — intended to train reporters at community newspapers — my education has served me well. For that, I shall be forever grateful to Sheridan. No matter where in the world my work takes me, I will wear my alumni pin with gratitude and pride.

Career Centre Launches Mentoring Program

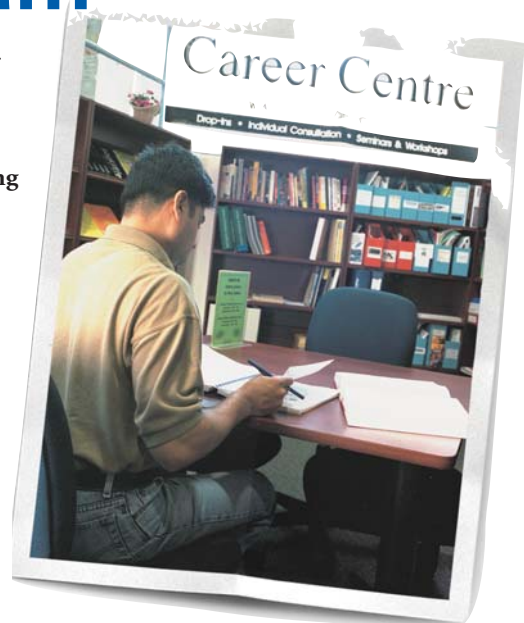
Sheridan's Career Centre is pleased to announce the launch of a new Mentoring Program for current Sheridan students, beginning January 2006.

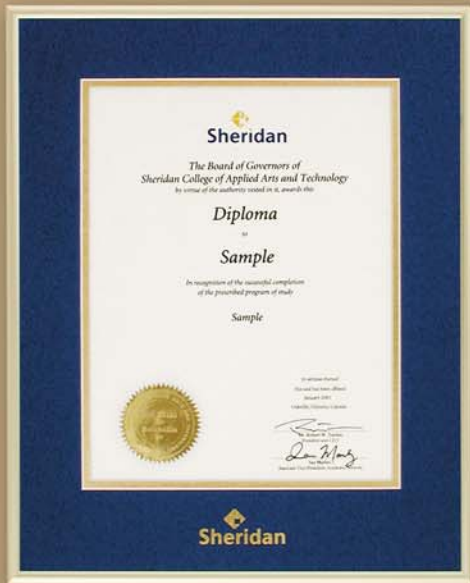
