■ The May/June issue of *Communication Arts* celebrates Illustration with its 52nd edition of the Illustration Annual. *Communication Arts* is one of the most prestigious journals for Design, Illustration, and Photography worldwide. Over 4000 images competed to be included in this annual and 181 images/series were awarded. Sheridan Illustration had 3 professors included as well as graduate **Mike Byers**, who was also featured in the 'Fresh' section for noteworthy new practitioners. Part-time faculty members **Julia Breckenreid** and **Thom Sevalrud** are included, as well as program coordinator **Joe Morse**.

■ The Canadian Decorator's Association (CDECA) announced the winners of the 2011 Awards for Design and Decorating at a gala reception in Toronto in April. The prestigious national awards recognize excellence in 6 categories. The recipient for the silver students award category went to one of our Sheridan Interior Decorating students. Silver award winner recipient is **Katarzyna Czerwonka**.

■ The Ceramics Studio thanks **Kate Hobin** for leading the program through this past year as Acting Studio Head. Her former experiences as a studio potter, instructor and faculty director of a multi-disciplinary arts program at the University of Saskatchewan were valuable assets appreciated by the faculty and students.

■ Professor **Rafael Goldchain's** work was included as part of *Revolutionizing Cultural Identity: Photography and the Changing Face of Immigration*. The show was held on June 2 at the Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21, Halifax.

■ Ceramics Studio faculty **Marc Egan**, **Gord Thompson** and **Cathleen Nicholson** attended a month long artist residency in May at Medalta International Artist in Residence in Medicine Hat Alberta.

■ *China: Images of a Civilization*, recently released, was developed in part by Professor **Michael J. Walsh**. This book was 25 years in the making and is published by the Government of China. This landmark book tells China's story with the western reader as its primary audience.

■ Faculty member **Ying-Yueh Chuang** received a 2010 Canada Council Project Grant for an artist residency at Pottery Workshop, Jingdezhen, China for summer 2011. She also received a 2011 Ontario Arts Council Craft Artists Creative Development Grant to work towards a solo exhibition in Sarnia, Ontario.

■ In May, faculty member, **Tony Clennell** (R.C.A.) travelled to Nanaimo, BC to present a 3 day workshop, participate on a panel for the BC Master Potters Symposium in Victoria and consult with North Vancouver University regarding setting up a 2 year course for studio potters. In June he did a workshop at Castroville Pottery in Texas and will be leading a workshop at Peter's Valley Craft Centre, NJ in August.

■ Students from BAA Illustration, Animation and Interior Design programs departed for a 32-day unique study abroad opportunity in Italy. Professor **Clemente Botelho** (BAA Illustration) is once again directing the curriculum and travel itinerary as the group explores Italy. Based in Florence, the students will investigate diverse aspects of Italian art and culture and will travel to Rome, Bologna, Sienna, and other locales before ending their adventure in Venice.
