Sustainability

Sheridan is committed to integrating sustainability into all aspects of teaching, learning, energy, waste and operations.

- » Sheridan is working with the Town of Oakville, the City of Brampton and other municipalities on Community Energy Plans to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from building energy use and transportation.
- » Sheridan reduced its waste sent to landfill by 53% (or 733 metric tons) in 2018-19 compared to 2013-14.
- » More than 1,100 Sheridan community members visited the Bike Hub at the Hazel McCallion Campus during the summer and fall of 2019. The HMC Bike Hub features a free bike rental program and a bike mentorship program. A Bike Hub opened at the Davis Campus in fall 2019, with full programming available in 2020.

Sheridan receives \$1.5 million in funding for the EDGE Innovation Hub

Sheridan's EDGE Hub, located at the Hazel McCallion Campus, is awarded \$1.5 in federal funding to support local entrepreneurs and social innovators.
