Program Length/ Hours/Weeks:	This is a 2 year full time program: 4 semesters of 15 weeks each with 1 reading (break) week. Classes are approximately 18 to 28 hours per week; hours are between 8:00a.m. and 10:00p.m., Monday to Friday. Programs starting in September have a four month break over the summer (from approximately mid-April to end of August) between first and second year. The holiday breaks are approximately 3 weeks. Programs starting in January and May run continuously over 16 months (no summer break). The holiday break is approximately 3 weeks, and breaks between semesters are 2 weeks. Students will be notified about their class schedule prior to the beginning of each semester.

Language Assessment for Essential Communication Skills Requirement

Prior to start of term, students will write a Language Assessment test (dates and times to follow,) which determines their placement in either Essential Communication Skills ECS (COMM19999) OR Communication Foundations CF (COMM19997). Essential Communication Skills is a mandatory requirement in order to graduate from this program; therefore, if students are placed in Communication Foundations they must successfully complete it, and then are required to enroll in and successfully complete Essential Communication Skills at their own expense. Withdrawal/Refund Policy	Students must officially withdraw from Sheridan post-secondary programs via the "Application for Term or Complete Program Withdrawal" form by the 10 th day of scheduled classes All fees are subject to a \$500 non-refundable registration charge, in accordance with policy set by the Ministry of Advanced Education and Skills Development. Any refund, less the non-refundable registration charge, will be refunded to the student in the form of a cheque. Students who pay for two or more terms in advance will receive a full refund of second semester fees providing the withdrawal is received prior to the fee payment deadline date of the subsequent term.
