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<p>Program Length/ Hours/Weeks:</p>	<p>This is a full time program over 2 years: 4 semesters of 15 weeks each with 1 reading (break) week.</p> <p>Sheridan offers an optional paid work placement for students carrying a grade-point average of 3.0 or higher and a minimum C in first semester courses. Enrolment is limited.</p> <p>Classes are approximately 18 to 28 hours per week; hours are between 8:00a.m. and 10:00p.m., Monday to Friday.</p> <p><u>Two Year Program starting in September- Regular Option (if GPA too low for CO-OP)</u> Students have a four month break over the summer between semesters 2 & 3, and a four month break between semester 3 & 4 (from approximately mid-December to early May). The holiday break is approximately three weeks.</p> <p><u>Two Year Program starting in September– CO-OP Option</u> Students have a four month co-op work term between semesters 2 & 3, and a four month co-op work term between semesters 3 & 4 (from approximately mid-December to early May). The holiday break is approximately three weeks.</p> <p><u>Two Year Program starting in January- Regular Option (if GPA too low for CO-OP)</u> Students have a 4 month break between semesters 2 & 3 and 4 month break between semesters 3 & 4; the break between semesters 2 & 3 is two weeks.</p> <p><u>Two Year Program starting in January – CO-OP Option</u> Students have a 4 month co-op work term between semesters 2 & 3 and a four month co-op work term between semesters 3 & 4; the break between semesters 2 & 3 is two weeks.</p> <p>Students will be notified about their class schedule prior to the beginning of each semester.</p>

Enrolment is limited through an additional selection process. Co-op and internship students pay an additional fee of \$535.00 per work term. This fee is collected with your tuition and goes to support the broad array of valuable support services provided to co-op students.</p> <p>Supplies and Materials – \$75 approximately Students are required to purchase small computer repair tools: #1 and #2 Philips screwdriver, wire cutters, and long nose pliers.</p> <p>Locker Fee - \$15 for one semester, \$25 for two semesters, and \$35 for one academic year (September – August). All students must provide their own lock. Payment will be by debit or credit card only.
