

New Student Checklist

There are many things to take care of before you start your classes – use this checklist to keep yourself on track!

✓ Pay your fees

You must pay your fees to ensure you're registered in classes. For more information, please visit fees.sheridancollege.ca

✓ Apply to the Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP)

All Ontario residents are encouraged to apply to OSAP as you may be eligible for other student financial aid. You can apply online at osap.gov.on.ca (be advised processing may take four to six weeks).

✓ Access your timetable and register for classes (if required)

Step-by-step instructions on how to access, modify or build your timetable and register online for your electives will be available on myotr.sheridancollege.ca. Check regularly for key registration dates.

✓ Write your Language Assessment (if required)

Students required to write the Language Assessment must do so *before* classes begin as this will ensure you're registered in the correct Communication Skills course. ✓ Attend New Student Orientation

Orientation is your first opportunity to meet your classmates, learn more about your program from your professors, and obtain the important information you need to be successful at Sheridan. Orientation dates and times vary by campus and program. Visit orientation.sheridancollege.ca for your specific date and time.

✓ Check your Sheridan email

Your Sheridan email account is used for all official Sheridan communications. Be sure to check your Sheridan [email](#) regularly before classes start and throughout the year for important information.

✓ Get your onecard (Student Photo ID) and add funds to your [Flex account](#)

Your onecard is proof that you're a registered Sheridan student and gives you access to campus facilities and services. To get your onecard at Orientation: [upload your photo online](#) at least two days before your event. You can also pay for select campus services using your onecard. ✓ Register with Accessible Learning

If you're a student with a documented disability or diagnosed mental health concerns who requires academic accommodations, be sure to register with Accessible Learning before classes start. For more information or to register, visit our [Accessible Learning](#) webpage.

✓ Buy your textbooks

Review your timetable to see which books you'll need for your classes. Buy your books [online](#) or at the Bookstore:

If you buy your books early, hold on to your receipt and keep your books in pristine condition until you're sure you won't need to return them.

✓ Apply for Transfer Credit

✓ Get your parking permit

✓ Rent a locker

You can rent a locker at any campus for \$15 per semester. To request a locker online through Parking and Locker Services, click [here](#).

✓ Bring or purchase an approved laptop (students in Mobile Computing programs only)

Students in Mobile Computing programs are required to bring a laptop to class that complies with their program's hardware and software standards. You can find your laptop requirements and access the laptop pre-check utility at: it.sheridancollege.ca/mobile.

✓ Start using your Health and Dental Plan

You're automatically covered by a comprehensive health and dental plan. To access your benefits:
