Subject: What you need to know before coming to Sheridan

Dear Sheridan Community,

Over the past eight months, Sheridan has collaborated with local public health authorities to develop detailed COVID-19 health and safety plans that have allowed some in-person activity to resume while respecting the Ontario framework for re-opening the province.

Sheridan continues to take its guidance and direction from our public health partners on all matters related to COVID-19 case reporting and management. Given that our multiple locations (Davis Campus, HMC Campus, Trafalgar Campus, Mississauga Daycare and the Screen Industries Research and Training Centre) exist in different municipalities (Brampton, Mississauga, Oakville, and Toronto) Sheridan is implementing the guidelines associated with the public health unit that has the most conservative approach deemed by community case counts. Currently, this is the Region of Peel - Public Health Unit.

As part of our shared responsibility to protect the health and wellbeing of our community, please do not come to Sheridan if any of the following circumstances apply to you:

1. You are experiencing [COVID-19 Symptoms](#);
2. You have been tested for COVID-19 and are waiting for the test results (exception for COVID-19 Surveillance Testing in accordance with health care, long-term care or retirement home screening requirements);
3. You tested positive for COVID-19 and have not completed your self-isolation requirements as directed by public health;
4. You have been in close contact (e.g. being less than 2 metres away in the same room or area, including at workplaces, or living in the same home) with someone in the last 48 hours before they developed COVID-19 symptoms and/or they are awaiting COVID-19 test results\*;
5. You have been in close contact (e.g. being less than 2 metres away in the same room or area, including at workplaces, or living in the same home) with someone within the 14 days after they developed COVID-19 symptoms and/or they are awaiting COVID-19 test results\*;
6. You or a person you live with has been advised by a public health unit or a health care practitioner to get tested for COVID-19;
7. A public health unit has identified you as a “close contact” of someone who currently has COVID-19;
8. A public health unit or a health care Practitioner has told you that you should currently be self-isolating (i.e. staying at home);
9. You have received a [COVID Alert](#) exposure notification on your cell phone\*;
10. You have travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days;
11. You live with someone who has travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days and the traveler is unable to self-isolate (i.e. keep a 2m distance from you and others in the same household); or
12. You live with someone who has travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days and the traveler has developed COVID-19 symptoms, regardless of the traveler’s ability to self-isolate.

If the above circumstances apply to you, please do not come on site. Instead, contact the Health Centre at 905-845-9430 ext. 5153.

\*Please note that for individuals who work in health care, long term care or retirement homes, if you were wearing the required and/or appropriate Personal Protective Equipment according to the type of duties you were performing (e.g. goggles or face shield, gloves, gown, and procedure mask [or an N95-mask for aerosol-generating medical procedure]) when you had close contact with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19, you are not considered to be exposed and can attend on campus activities.

I appreciate this may be concerning and would like to remind you that confidential counselling is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week from [EmpowerME](#) or [KeepMeSafe](#).
