

## **Top 10 Off-Campus Housing Tips!**

- 1. Know your Rights! Look into the <u>local by-laws</u> that landlords must abide by to ensure you are renting a legal unit. (Did you know that Brampton has over <u>4500 registered</u> Two-unit Dwellings?)
- 2. Start a checklist to compare your housing options and what they offer.
- 3. Know your budget. Look for the most financially reasonable option for you and look for roommates to help lower the costs.
- 4. Consider who your roommates are and think about coming up with a <u>roommate</u> <u>agreement</u>.
- 5. Make sure to view the unit before you sign a lease agreement or make a deposit. Also, ask the Landlord questions about the unit to seek clarity on items such as, security deposit, utilities, parking, repairs, guests, lease renewals, and subletting.
- 6. Ensure you know proper safety procedures and requirements (fire prevention safety).
- 7. Confused about the lease agreement terms? Seek assistance before you sign.
- 8. Be sure to check <u>Places4students</u> for postings around campus! This platform also provides subletting options and roommate profiles.
- 9. If you are checking other resources (Kijiji, Facebook Marketplace) make sure to look out for misleading postings and ensure the unit compliant with all local bylaws (see point 1).
- 10. Become familiar with important resources like <u>Residential Tenancies Act (RTA)</u>, <u>Landlord and Tenant Board (LTB)</u>, in case any Landlord related issues occur and <u>Ontario's standard lease agreement</u>. Google these to find out more!

\*Remember to be a **Good Neighbour!** Follow local by-laws regarding **garbage**, **noise** and **parking!**
